In Spring 2023, Dr. Shelley Staples published an article with SLAT grad Dr. Emily Palese and BA English grad Hannah Gill along with other colleagues on the Crow project. The article, published in Composition Studies, focuses on the Crow Repository as a resource for professional development in writing programs. She also published a paper with a graduate student advisee from Iran, Ahmad Ansarifar, in the Spanish Journal of Applied Linguistics which is a multi-dimensional analysis of academic abstracts. With Dr. Xun Yan, UIUC, she published a research report on a British Council (IELTS) funded study. Dr. Staples attended AAAL 2023 and presented with three SLAT students on two separate projects: first, for the IELTS study, with Mariana Centanin-Bertho, and second, for a implementing corpus-informed study materials in SLW classes at UA, with Anh Dang and Hui Wang. She also presented on ongoing work with Dr. Bethany Gray (Iowa State) focused on undergraduate graduate student writing. In Summer 2023, Dr. Staples was invited as a guest tutor for the Summer School for Applied Linguistics and TESOL at University of Malta. She also gave a workshop on corpus-informed materials development to faculty of that university's Center for English Language Proficiency.


