- LIT / Lit Grad Curriculum Rep (Larissa):
  - From Larissa: would folks be interested in a graduate student discussion group about the current academic job market and strategies for success? MLA had one of these and it was super helpful
  - Notes from last Friday's literature faculty meeting:
    - students. Looked at model of being even as possible across the programs, so 3-3-3-2. Literature has the most "personeers" of any program. What that means is that we have the most obligations. Looking at our current obligations, we have about 33% percent of the personeers in the department but we also have the highest success rate of people graduating. Literature is being asked to consider lowering its number. One suggestion put forward was that every program has 25% of those

personeers. One method would be to have the programs that are smaller get more and those that are bigger would get less. Option 1 was to give us 0, which would put us at 30%. Another is 2 which would put us at 32%. The current plan is to ask more questions, particularly given our highest success rate. Agreed that we cannot do zero.

- Also discussed other possible solutions, such as having alternating incoming cohorts and collaborating with RCTE since many RCTE students take literature courses and might like to take more. Could be a way to pool resources together.
- MFA programs considering rolling back from 3 year to 2 year program in response to similar pressures
- Ongoing problem of GAT slots and CT faculty positions being tied together. Discussed how CT still need higher wages. If CT want a raise, lit faculty agree they should support them. Also want to protect lit student slots. Should be a both/and.
- Want to get a literacy center going for public outreach and as a potential source of external funding. Would also help to show that literature is contributing in tangible ways. Idea is to get permissions for a website first and then develop a center. Permissions will have to be sought for this.
  - Could make this to where literature does things like offer support, work with HS instructors, have talks, etc.
- Lastly, want to raise questions about standardizing official hiring process.
- RCTE Rep (Kelli):
  - GA distributions within the Department of English
    - a total of eleven TAships to be distributed across all programs. Under a proposed plan, RCTE would only receive two GAships in 24-25 academic year
  - RCTE MA online (3 submitted for MA this fall)
    - Soft launch in fall (2024)
    - MA students will not be funded through the department.
    - PTW already models mostly online curriculum, including a few cross listed 400/500 courses that could fold into the offerings.
    - Logistics means fewer day classes, more evening classes.
    - Possible hybrid approach to courses, and to align synchronous sessions with important outcomes, meaning that we can have fewer synchronous sessions but for a longer amount of time to accomplish certain course goals.
    - Marketing to rural community colleges to help instructors meet the HLC rules.
    - Adapt our curriculum to support alt ac professionals, finding relevant topics, tech, and research practices.

## **New Concerns & Homework:**

- ONGOING: Remind people of travel, research, professional development, and other funding with low-stakes application processes!
  - EGU Travel Awards for "official university business" travel up to \$500 to cover costs of presenting work at a conference
  - English Graduate Student Research Fund up to \$500 for research travel/field work. Money can no longer be used for local research costs as of Spring 2022 (including buying books, transcription software, etc.)
  - GPSC Travel, Research, and Professional Development grants three separate applications for different types of opportunities; up to \$750 for eligible research travel or research project costs, up to \$1500 for eligible Professional Development costs
  - GPSC Basic Needs Microgrant up to \$200 "to alleviate some of the financial burden students might be experiencing by helping cover healthcare, academic, hygiene, childcare, transportation, and/or housing-related essential costs;" four deadlines throughout year; awarded on first-come, first-serve basis via lottery selection
